




Programme aim + Participation

All designed to help get your idea off the ground.








Facts & Figures

- 5,645 enquiry search specifications have been forwarded to academic partners
- 3,449 businesses introduced to academic partners
- 2,650 company and university collaborative projects initiated
- 97% of businesses said that their project would either not have happened or taken longer without support from Interface
- 92% of expertise searches identified capability and capacity within partner
 Universities / Research Institute's for consideration by the companies
- 83% of businesses recorded reduced operating costs, increased productivity, profits, export, turnover and new or safeguarded employment
- 71% of first-time company/university collaborations involved companies seeking expertise in a discipline different to their own business sector




