
Programme aim + Participation




Facts & Figures



Inclusive Innovation Programme

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Innovation (IV) and Advanced Innovation Vouchers (AIV)

IVs are to start a new relationship between an organisation and a university/college to the value of £5k.

AIVs are aimed at building sustained relationships between organisations and universities/ colleges who may have previously collaborated together or for those companies who are beginning their collaborative journey with an academic partner. A minimum of £2.5k cash contribution and £2.5k in kind is required which is then matched by the Scottish Funding Council up to a total project value of £20k.
